

Citizen ID Forum 2009: Agenda of the Global eID Summit Announced

The Citizen ID Forum opens its doors in Abu Dhabi on February 15-16, 2009 with the patronage of the UAE Minister of Interior, the endorsement of the European Commission, and the support of the Emirates Identity Authority and Abu Dhabi Police
